In a memo dated February 3, 2021, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health issued a revision to their December bulletin regarding non-essential travel. In that memo, the self-quarantine requirements were revised as follows:

“3. Any person arriving in or returning to the county of Los Angeles from another state or country must quarantine for 10 days after arrival...” The previous directive restricted non-essential travel to the Southern California Region. This revision allows non-essential travel throughout the state without the requirement of self-quarantine. Requirements for essential travel as defined in the bulletin have remained the same. (See attached revision.)

**Please be advised, employees will not be permitted to work during his/her 10 day quarantine.**

We will be discussing the impact of all of these requirements and revisions of LA County directives with CSEA in the immediate future.
